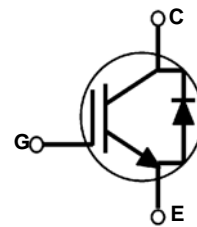
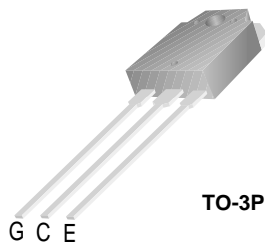

Figure 1. Typical Output Characteristics

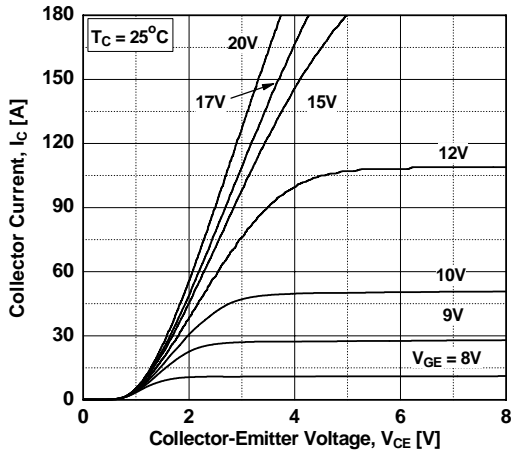


Figure 2. Typical Output Characteristics

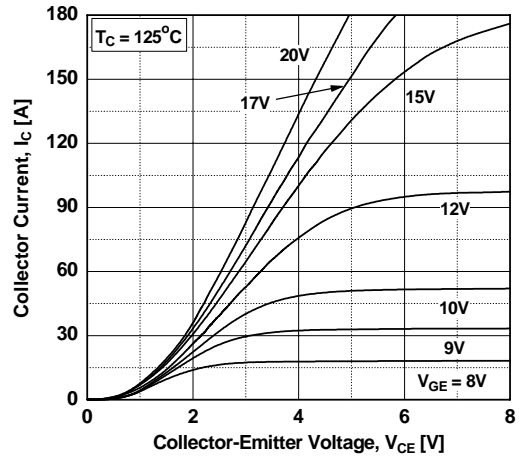


Figure 3. Typical Saturation Voltage Characteristics

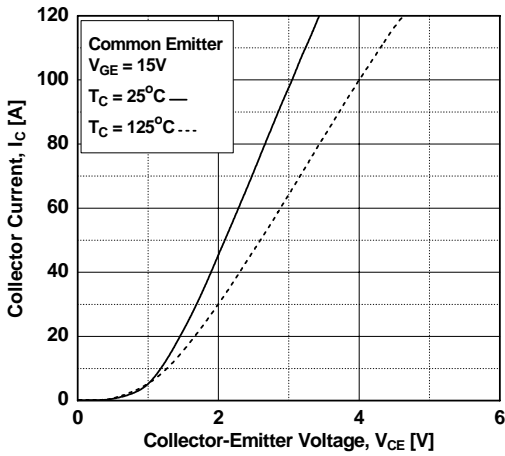


Figure 4. Transfer Characteristics

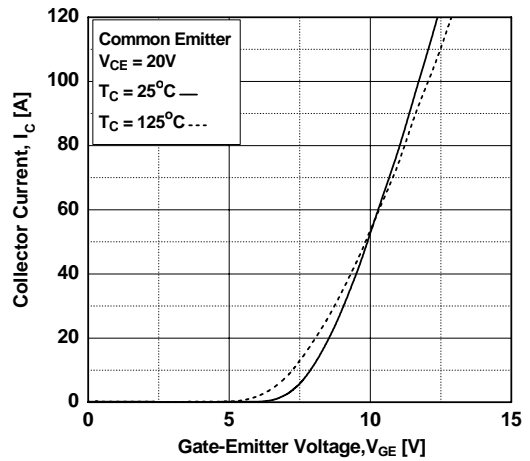


Figure 5. Saturation Voltage vs. Case Temperature at Variant Current Level

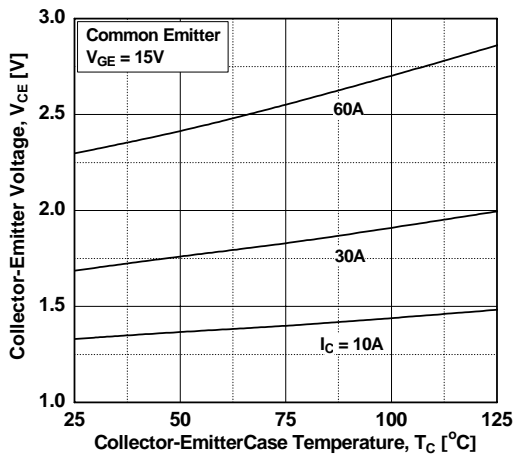
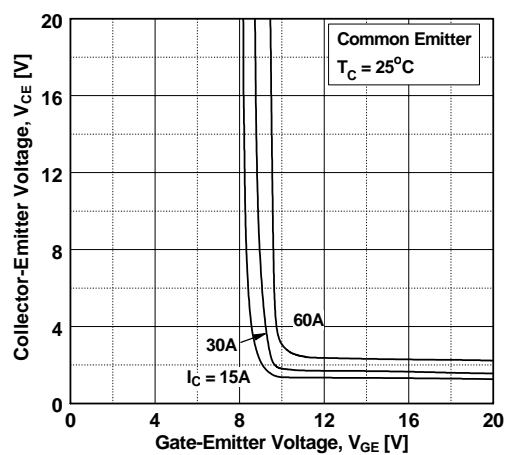


Figure 6. Saturation Voltage vs. Vge

Figure 7. Saturation Voltage vs. V_{GE}

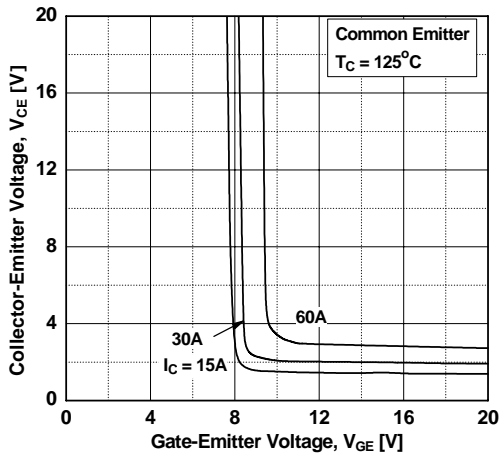


Figure 8. Capacitance Characteristics

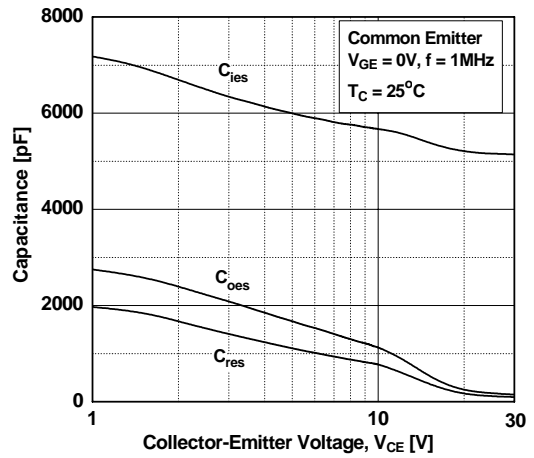


Figure 9. Gate charge Characteristics

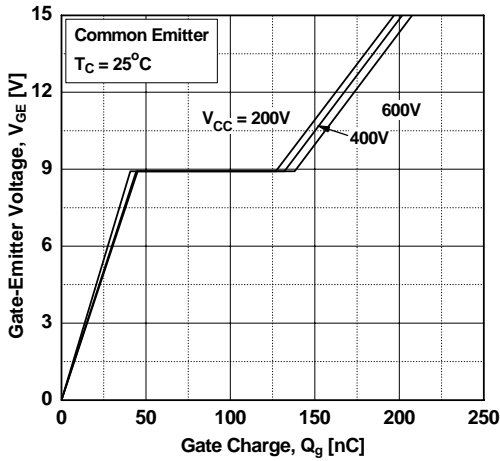


Figure 10. SOA Characteristics

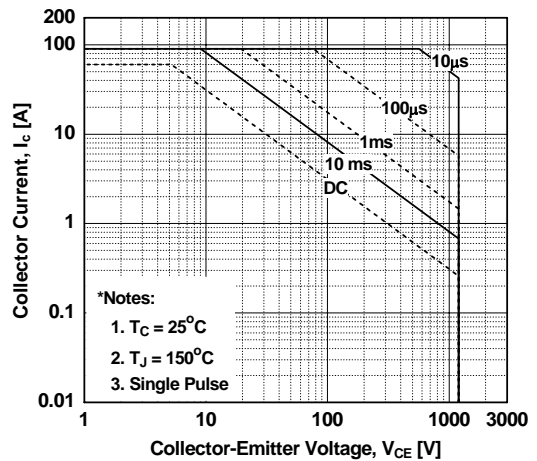


Figure 11. Turn-on Characteristics vs. Gate Resistance

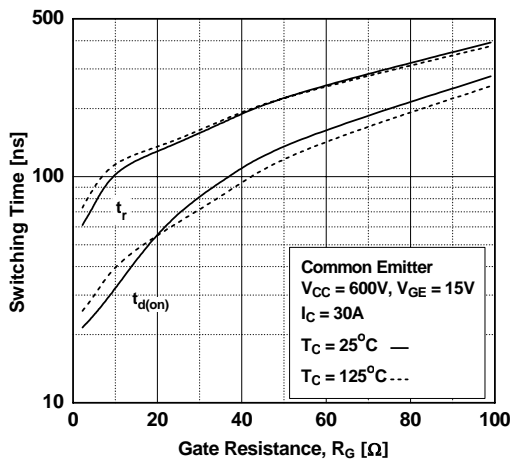
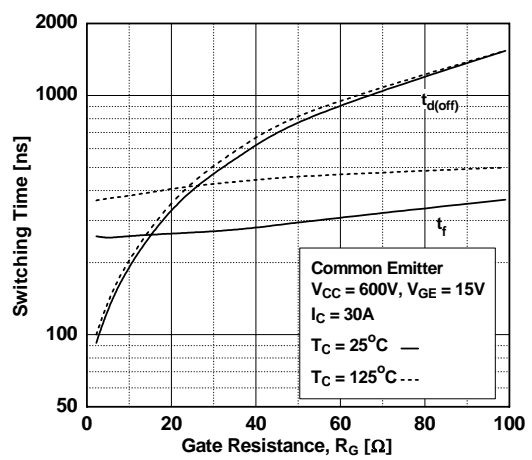


Figure 12. Turn-off Characteristics vs. Gate Resistance

Figure 13. Turn-on Characteristics vs. Collector Current

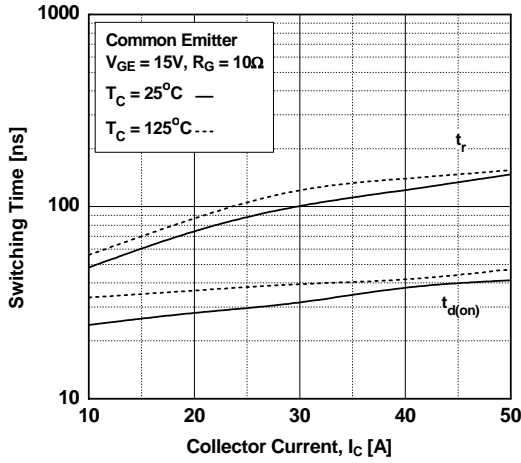


Figure 14. Turn-off Characteristics vs. Collector Current

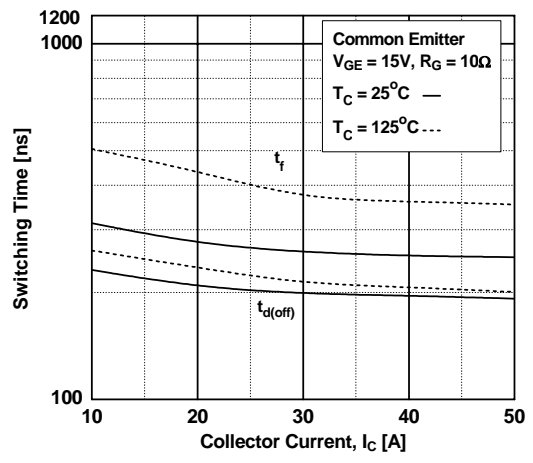


Figure 15. Switching Loss vs. Gate Resistance

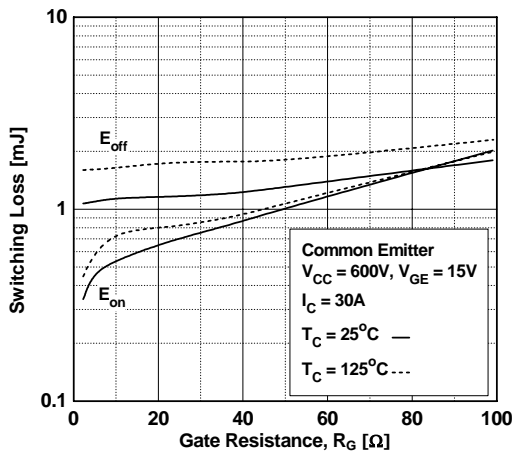


Figure 16. Switching Loss vs. Collector Current

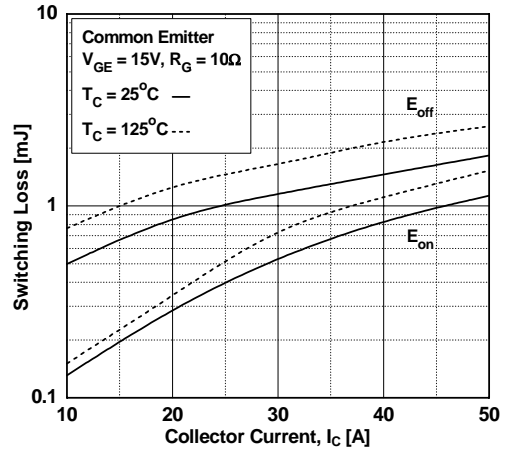


Figure 17. Turn off Switching SOA Characteristics

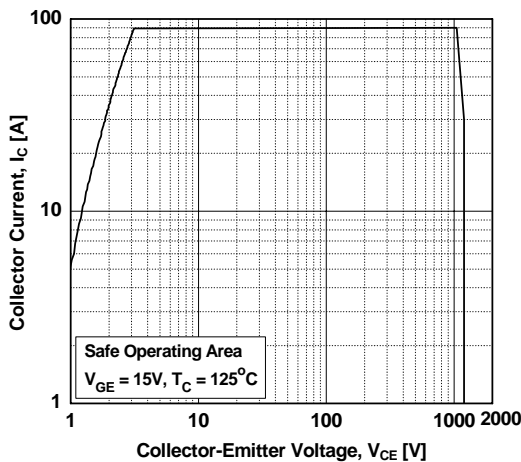
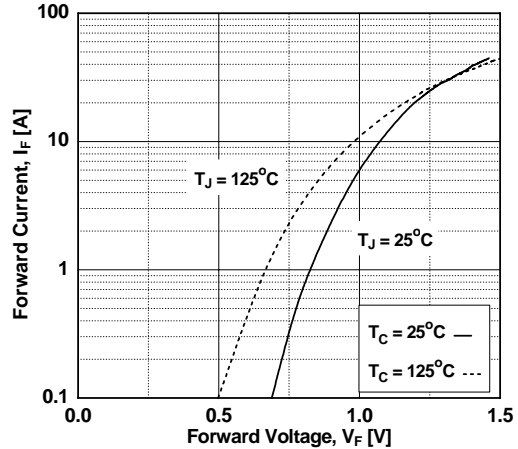


Figure 18. Forward Characteristics

Figure 19. Reverse Current

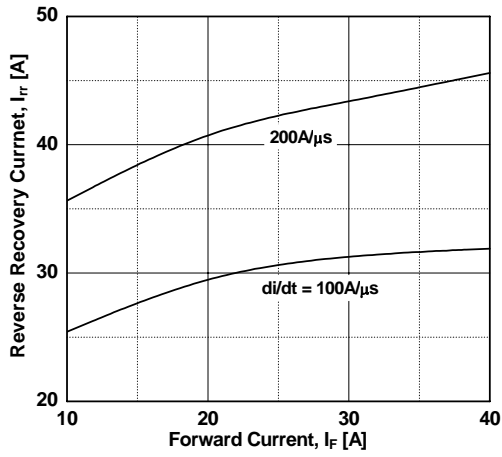


Figure 20. Stored Charge

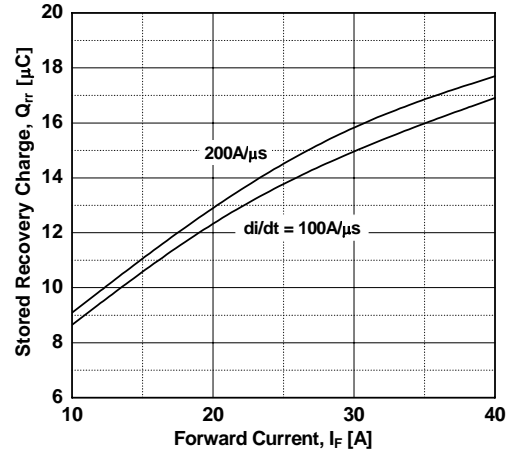


Figure 21. Reverse Recovery Time

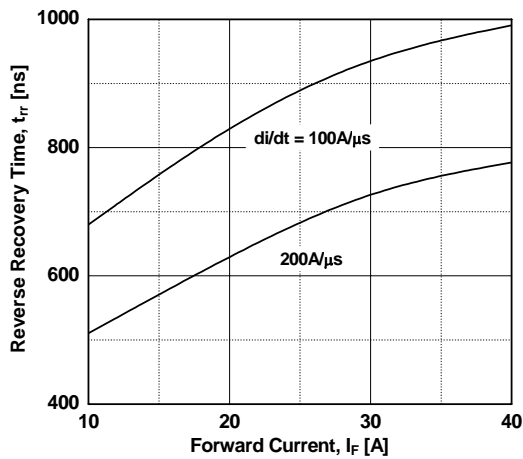
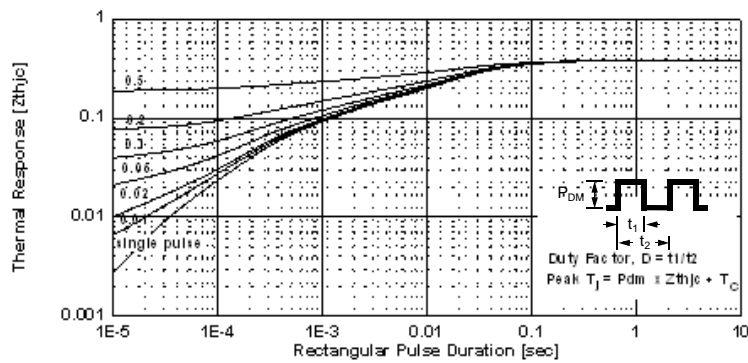
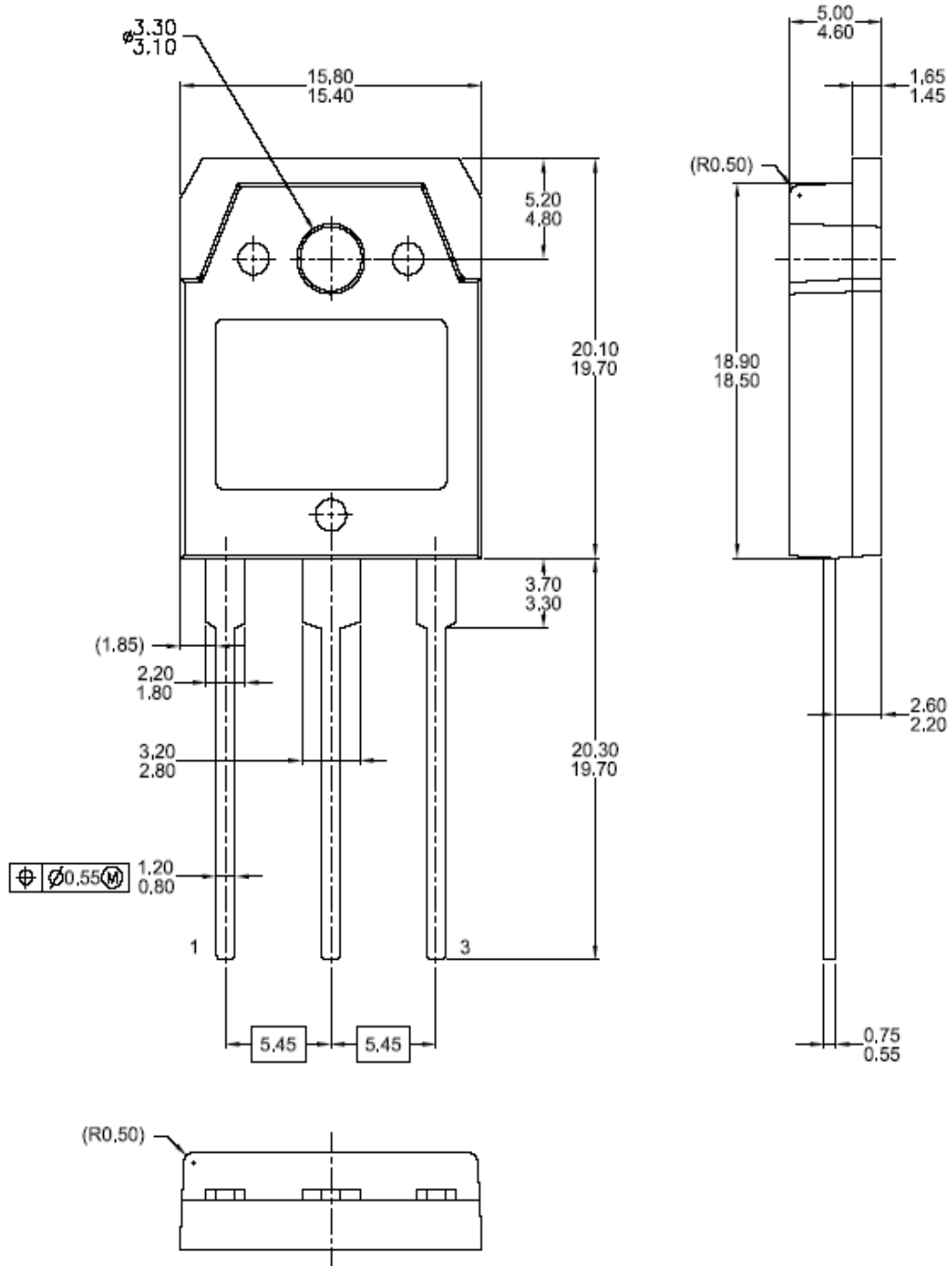


Figure 22. Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT
